MINUTES

Item

Round robin

- Member discussion about what they had been hearing and seeing amongst stakeholders and community members related to renewable energy. This included:
 - concerns around workforce accommodation management plans and the impacts to the region, notably the local housing market, as more projects come online.
 - <u>upcoming community drop-in sessions</u> for residents to find out more about the HIF e-Fuel plant earmarked for South Burnie.
 - the <u>Clean Energy Centre of Excellence</u> at TasTAFE's Burnie campus has appointed two positions, with provisional training courses to be available in 2026.
 - in collaboration with TasTAFE, UTAS will launch the 'power professional pathway' in the second half of next year, which includes professional experience placements and industry connections.
 - TasNetworks is recruiting for its <u>Community Benefits Sharing Program</u> independent assessment panel, who will be responsible for reviewing and selecting successful initiatives for funding.

Meet and greet NWTD Project Director

- <u>NWTD Project Director Richard (Richie) Sheather</u> was introduced to the group, having recently been appointed to the position.
- Richie brings extensive experience in leading large-scale energy and infrastructure projects across Australia, New Zealand, and India, including the development of Tasmania's natural gas networks and multi-billion-dollar transitions in telecommunications and pipeline assets.
- Richie took members through the project timeline, noting construction is scheduled for the first half of 2026.

NWTD head contractor

- GenusPlus Group Ltd (Genus) updated the group on the design for Stage 1 of the NTWD project, with 70 per cent progression for the transmission lines as well the Burnie and Palmerston (near Cressy) substations.
- Genus employment opportunities prioritise local regional recruitment and will be phased in line with project milestones. A workforce resourcing prediction was also shared.
- Advertising for apprenticeships transmission linesman and electrical will kick off in early 2026, with successful applicants to begin in mid-2026.

NWTD update

- Members were provided with an update on key project milestones and timeframes, with the submission of the second Contingent Project Application scheduled for late October.
- Recent and upcoming NWTD community engagement sessions were shared with the group, including key takeaways from attendance at this year's Burnie Show and Wynyard Tulip Festival.
- An update on land access and acquisition across Stage 1 was also shared.

Community investment

- An NWTD community investment update was provided, including the insights from last week's <u>Community Benefits Sharing Program</u> workshops in Burnie and Deloraine where feedback was gathered about the program and the level of information and support needed for community groups to apply for funding was identified.
- TasNetworks' extending its partnership arrangements with <u>Rural Alive & Well (RAW)</u> was also highlighted.

Contingent Project Application 2 update

- A summary of <u>TasNetworks' Contingent Project Application (CPA) 2 to the Australian</u> <u>Energy Regulator (AER)</u> relating to construction delivery costs was shared with the group, this included:
 - Total capex
 - Cost estimate by category
 - Concessional financing
 - Pricing assumptions
 - Revenue and price impacts

Infrastructure Sustainability Rating

- The <u>Infrastructure Sustainability (IS) Rating Scheme</u> is an assessment tool used to evaluate the sustainability performance of horizontal infrastructure.
- It was noted that the NWTD will be one of the first projects in Tasmania to undertake an IS Rating, with TasNetworks aiming to achieve a version 2.1 Bronze Rating.
- Members were given details on the NWTD objectives and targets across the different themes, with members to provide feedback.

Marinus Link update

- <u>Marinus Link</u> shared recent community engagement activities, including commencing engagement on Community Benefits Sharing Framework with a number of key stakeholders in the region as well as attending the BIG Science Fair in Burnie.
- Marinus Link also provided a status update, <u>with a record concessional loan of close to</u> \$4B from the Clean Energy Finance Corporation being secured to reach financial close.
- A meet the contractors event is scheduled for early December 2026.

Any other business

• The Chair raised the matter of SLG moving forward in relation to how the function can best support the project through construction phase. This will be discussed in December.
