

## TasNetworks Office Sharing Register

TasNetworks maintains this register in accordance with clause 4.2.4 of the Australian Energy Regulator's (AER's) Electricity Distribution Ring-fencing Guideline (**the Guideline**). This register must be updated at least quarterly (15 January, April, July and October each year).

The table below sets out the offices that are shared between TasNetworks and a Related Electricity Service Provider (**RESP**) who provides contestable electricity services and identifies which of the following exemptions from the Guideline is met:

- 4.2.1 (b)i.** *Offices for staff:*
- a.** *Who do not have access to electricity information;*
  - b.** *who have access to electricity information but do not have, in performing the roles, functions or duties of their staff position, any opportunity to use that electricity information to engage in conduct that is contrary to the Guideline.*
  - c.** *who only have access to electricity information to the extent necessary to perform services that are not electricity services (such as general administration, accounting, payroll, human resources, legal or regulatory, or information technology support services)*
- 4.2.1 (b)iii.** *Staff located at a regional office*
