

Residential prices for 2022-23 (as approved by the Australian Energy Regulator)

Residential customers in Tasmania are supplied under one of our consumption based network tariffs, either:

Residential time of use consumption (TAS93)

The residential time of use consumption tariff (TAS93) is the default network tariff for all new residential customers or customers who have an advanced meter installed.

This network tariff offers lower network charges during off-peak times – including weekends in their entirety.

TasNetworks is seeing an increasing number of customers take up this tariff to take advantage of the cost reflective pricing.

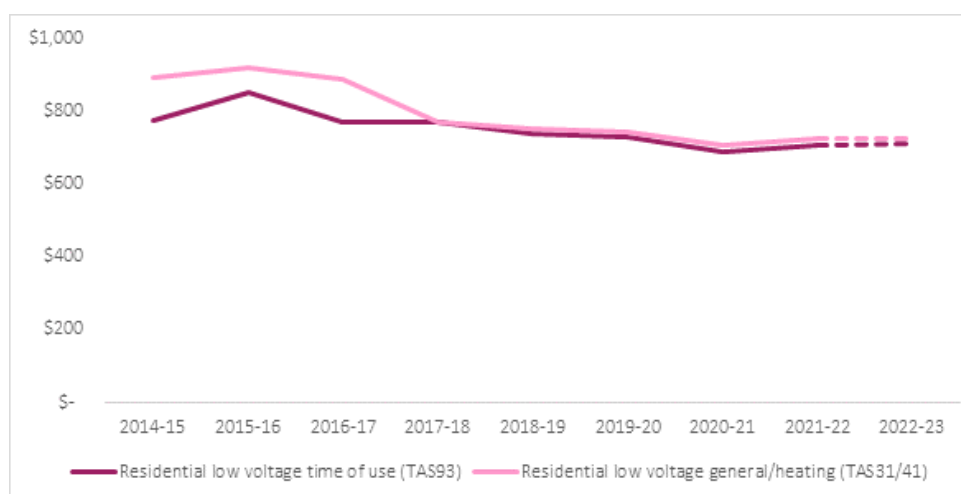
Residential general light and power (TAS31) with heating and hot water (TAS41)

The remaining residential customers are mostly supplied under the combination of two flat rate network tariffs; the residential low voltage general tariff (TAS31) for general power and lighting, and the uncontrolled low voltage heating tariff (TAS41) for home heating and/or hot water. These tariff offers the same price regardless of the time of day or day of the week.
