## Small Business Prices for 2023-24

(as approved by the Australian Energy Regulator)

Small business customers in Tasmania are supplied under one of our three business network tariffs, either:

### Time of use consumption (TAS94)

The low voltage time of use consumption tariff (TAS94) is the default network tariff for all new small business customers or customers who have an advanced meter installed. This network tariff offers lower network charges during off-peak times.

TasNetworks is seeing an increasing number of customers take up this tariff to take advantage of the cost reflective pricing.

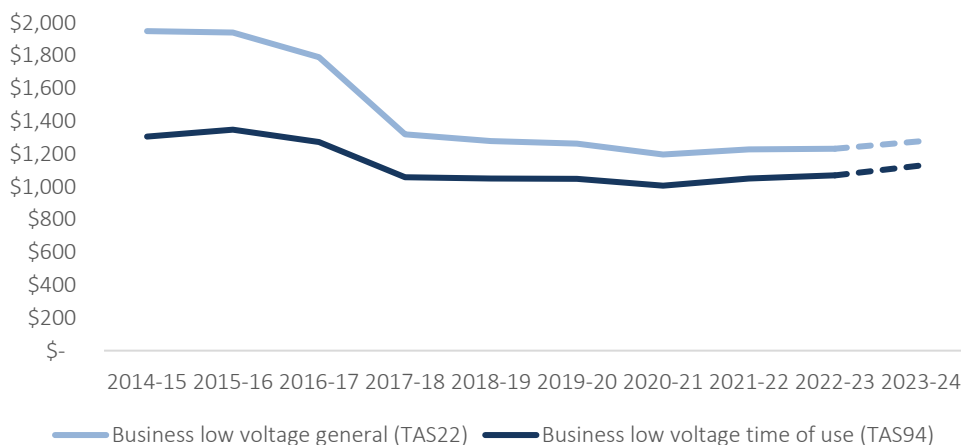
### Low voltage general (TAS22) and Time of use demand (TAS88)

The remaining residential customers are supplied under either our flat rate tariff – low voltage general network tariff (TAS22) – or the time of use demand based network tariff (TAS88).

Off-peak charge	17.913	↑ 17.3%

### Average annual network charge for a typical small business customer

When setting prices, TasNetworks always assesses the impact of prices changes on a “typical small business customer”. The chart below shows the average annual network charge of a typical customer since 2014-15.
